Confession and Forgiveness

P Let us pray, and confess our sins to the Lord God. May our words be sincere and true, and express our heartfelt sorrow and repentance.

(silence for personal confession and self-examination)

- **P** Jesus, Savior of all,
- **C** Forgive my sins. Forgive the sins I remember, and the sins I have forgotten. Forgive my many failures in the face of temptation, and those times when I have been stubborn in the face of correction. Forgive me for not living up to my identity as a baptized child of God, and for allowing the world to influence my thoughts and behaviors. Forgive me, Lord, not because I deserve your mercy, but only because of your grace. Amen.

In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for you, and for His sake God forgives you all your sins. To those who believe in Jesus Christ He gives the power to become the children of God and bestows on them the Holy Spirit. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.



- C Enable all who are baptized to be faithful in Your service, that we may rejoice to be called children of God, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Epistle

Romans 6:1–11


¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Holy Gospel

A The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the third chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

¹⁵As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, ¹⁶John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

¹⁸So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. ¹⁹But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

²¹Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, ²²and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

- **A** This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- **G** Praise to You, O Christ.

Renewal of Baptismal Vows

- ▶ Brothers and sisters in Christ, it is appropriate on this day of the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ that we remember and renew the vows once spoken at our Baptisms -- that time when we were washed of our sins and received the Holy Spirit to dwell within us. Let us boldly make our confession of faith before God, renouncing the sinful life of godless men and women and embracing the godly life of the Spirit-filled Christian. I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- **C** I renounce them.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **C** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- **C** I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- **C** I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
- **P** You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism?
- **C** I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.
- People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?
- **C** We do, and we ask God to help and guide us every day, as we live out our baptismal life. Amen.



The Words of Our Lord



Distribution of Holy Communion THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION AT GRACE LUTHERAN


